Purpose of the role:

• To assist the reserves team with the management of College Lake and Pitstone Fennature reserves.

Type of activities you will be involved in:

Reserve management: Will include practical habitat management, livestock management, maintenance of site infrastructure, leading volunteer teams and biological surveying. Examples of tasks: Fencing, brushcutter operation, tree felling using a chainsaw, habitat surveys, scrub management, footpath maintenance. The tasks are extremely varied.

There will also be opportunities to experience public engagement such as helping at events or guided walks.
