Purpose of the role:

To assist the Land Management Team with the management of the nature reserves of Berkshire

Type of activities you will be involved in:

Berkshire Land Management Wildlife Trainees assist the Land Management team to carry out a programme of works across our nature reserves in Berkshire. You will help on a variety of habitats including heathland, woodland, wetland and grassland carrying out practical habitat maintenance/restoration including scrub clearance, tree felling and removal of invasive species. Tasks will also include site infrastructure maintenance such as fencing, gate repairs and sign installation; you will gain experience working with and leading volunteer groups; there will be many opportunities to experience livestock handling; to join in with species and habitat surveys and to assist with preparation and delivery of wider community events.

- Some previous experience of practical conservation
- A good level of physical fitness
- Willingness to use power tools
- Ability to engage with a range of people
- Willingness to supervise and lead others
