
Can you help us achieve our dream and become part of our story?

To include a gift in your will to BBOWT you will need to give your solicitor the following details:

Name and address of the charity: Berkshire, Buckinghamshire & Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust, The Lodge, 1 Armstrong Road, Littlemore, Oxford, OX4 4XT.

Registered Charity Number: 204330

Here are some common questions answered that you may find useful:

• Why should you make a will?

It is the only way to be absolutely certain that your money and your belongings go to the people and causes you care about. It is also important to review your will from time to time to make sure that it still reflects your wishes for the future.

I already have a will – what is involved in updating it?

If you would like to update an existing will to include a gift to the Berkshire, Buckinghamshire & Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust you should speak to your solicitor to discuss your plans in detail. In some circumstances, your solicitor may be able to add your request to your existing will.

Can I restrict my gift?

It is helpful for us to be able to use gifts in wills for general purposes, where they are most needed at the time. If you wish to leave a gift for a specific purpose, please speak to us before you finalise your will. By discussing your wishes, we can be certain your gift will provide a fitting and lasting testament to your love of our natural heritage.

• Can you be my Executor?

Unfortunately, we are not yet able to offer this service. Executors can be family members, friends or legal representatives. They will be responsible for administering your estate and ensuring that your wishes are carried out so it is important that your Executors know where your will is stored.

• Should I use any specific wording in my will?

Your solicitor will be able to advise you; however, please do contact us if you would like to check any specific wording.

What if I have assets outside the UK?

Depending on the country there may be different requirements, so always take professional legal advice in these circumstances. If you have a complex estate, solicitors will be able to answer all your questions. They can also advise you on how to reduce your inheritance tax bills.

Do I need to be wealthy to leave a gift in my will to BBOWT?

Every gift, no matter the size, makes a huge difference to our work. After providing for your loved ones, we would be honoured to be remembered in your will. For example, you could leave 99% of your estate to your loved ones and 1% to charity.
